Presence Candles and Communion Bread

It is once again time to begin forming our presence candle and communion bread rotations.

Presence candles, which sit alongside the tabernacle, in both the sanctuary and chapel, remind us of God's nearness in the reserved sacrament our tabernacles contain. Each year, we invite members to donate \$25, in thanksgiving, or in memory, a candle for one month of their choice. A sign-up sheet is located at the Spirit Hub for members to let us know the month desired. If the month you desire is filled in, we have been known to have more than one family sponsoring a candle. Also at the Spirit Hub, are blue cards to be filled out and forwarded to the office to let us know if you wish to give in thanksgiving or in memory. Outreach

Moving Vets Forward



Thanks to the parish's generosity, we raised just over \$750 for Moving Vets Forward. With those funds we were able to purchase 7 microwave ovens, 10 blankets, 10 bed sheet sets, 4 mattress pads, and 4 Bibles.



Trunk or Treat

Another successful Trunk or Treat. While the numbers were down from last year, we estimated only about 150 neighborhood youth attended, we were ready to meet them in the parking lot with open trunks, beautifully decorated, lots of candy, and in the parish hall, games where they could win more candy and prizes. Thank you to all who volunteered their time to make this event something we heard the neighborhood looks forward to each year.













Thanksgiving Boxes

This month we will once again be providing the Bellevue Food Pantry with Thanksgiving Box sets. Each box will feed a family of four and includes a \$25 Baker's gift card so that families can choose for themselves the protein they will enjoy on the holiday. There is still a few days to contribute to this outreach project. The estimated cost per box is \$45 and our goal is 40 boxes this year.



Dominican Republic Mission

Once again, a team of DioNeb volunteers are heading off to the Dominican Republic to work alongside the parishioners of Mission Santa Ana. After two years serving this community, this will likely be the last trip to Mission Santa Ana as the building repairs and upgrades are largely complete. Fr Tom, along with Fr John Schaefer, are working with the Diocese of the Dominican Republic to relocate to the center of the island near the city of

Advent Workshop



Vestry Meeting Minutes October 10, 2024

Search Committee Update:

Bill French has submitted the parish profile to the diocese October 6th. They will have someone reformat it & then post. We don't know when it will be posted yet.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Operational Expense Review by Fr. Tom: Pledge offering is down to 94% but Fr. Tom expects that to rise as the fall programs begin. Overall, we are at 97% on our operating income. This is a good place to be as we head into the latter part of the year. The only thing that was a little more expensive was the subscription to the cloud help desk. All Ministry expenses were all within the budgeted area. We are still in the black year-to date at \$6100.

CIE Report:

\$580 Miscellaneous; Octoberfest, Trunk or Treat, Magnetic calendars are here. DOK fund: \$400 gift for Terri Storm's ordination. \$236 Rector Checking account for family assistance. \$8000 discretionary fund that was motioned last month for building fund and lighting fund. Building fund: \$2160 was tree removal and phone system update. Youth fund was for one of our outings. Moving Vets Forward: \$245 and we purchased 7 microwaves. There will be more we can add to that. \$3358 for driveway lights. There will be another expense on that next month because they forgot to bill the shipping fee. **M10-10-01**: Rick Horejs moved and Barb Smith seconded to accept the report as presented. Unanimously approved. **M10-10-02** Patrick Howell moved and Rick Horejs seconded to pay the bills. Unanimously approved.

UPCOMING EVENTS

Fr. Tom is going on vacation tomorrow. Fr. Mark Selvey will be here this weekend. Next weekend deacons Terri & Ted will lead morning and evening prayer. No supply priest was available.

Annual Council and Trunk or Treat are coming up. On Saturday November 2nd we have Lee Moffett's wedding here at 11am. They will need the church all day long. Patrick will open up the church that morning.

Installation of the New Presiding Bishop is also November 2nd. They will show it online. Once I get a link I will send it out to the parish. It begins at 9am our time. November 3rd is All Saints. Wednesday November 6th we will be doing the Thanksgiving boxes. Anyone can join us. It will be around 11:30am. Fr. Tom leaves for the D.R. November 9th and Mark Selvey will be our supply priest again. Friday December 6th at 6:30pm will be Vestry Dinner at Fr. Tom's house. Vestry on November 14th, Mobile Pantry November 16th, November 17th, There will be a speaker on Dementia during coffee hour.

DISCUSSION ITEMS/UPDATES

Water Damage: Cindy said there was no update on the water damage reimbursement. The insurance still has not responded.

Sanctuary lighting: Fr. Tom heard from Phil; they are still looking at a November installation. The microphone updates are still not here.

2025 Giving cards are here & will be going out this weekend.

Drivewy lighting: All new lighting in the driveway has ben installed. The broken light above the red doors is under warranty and we will hopefully get that fixed when the new Sanctuary lighting is installed.

New Phone system replacement is in place.

Endowment Fund Grant requests are due by 15 Dec. Please remind your ministries.

Vestry members and ministry teams were encouraged to check and empty their mailboxes.

Vestry members were asked to carefully review the VPoD checklist and notify Cindy if any changes are needed.

The checklist provide valuable information about preparing the building for worship securing it before leaving.

2025 Budget: Draft #3 of the upcoming budget was discussed. Our total income is expected to be \$229,956 which is a small drop. Operating expenses will go up, especially because of the cost of paper rising. Bank checks, \$1800, Day by Day was in 2 budgets so it was taken out of Christian Ed. Fund. Postage will be down. Fr. Tom bought extra rolls this year. Cleaning services will be up due to paper costs. Utilities, we brought up to \$5000 for now. Prices should be lower than 2 years ago. Rector search: Cindy has a meeting with Canon Liz and Beth Bryne to determine our compensation number. Then we will have a better idea of the total. Ministry budgets have all come in except 4. We are currently \$20,000 in the hole for next year if we meet the expected contributions.

Christian Ed. Our team will have an All-Saints party Sunday November 3rd.

Troop 483: Rick said scouting is going well and they have voting for leadership coming up. They now have half girls and half boys running.

Trunk or Treat: Judy checked that volunteers should arrive at 2:30pm on Sunday October 27th. Fr. Tom needs more volunteers for the inside games. It will go from 3-5pm.

DECISION ITEMS

We received a check for \$33,000 from the insurance company to repair the roof. By the time we could get the roofing company involved, the chalk marks were washed away. The roofing company does not see any damage that needs to be fixed. It was recommended we place the funds received into the Endowment Fund for future repairs as needed. M10-10-03: Fr. Tom moves we move the money to the endowment fund and earmark it until we know what needs to be done. Judy Darell seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

<u>M10-10-04</u>: Cindy Pekarek motioned to adjourn the meeting. Judy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.
