
Holiday Service Times


As Advent unfolds and Christmas approaches, we are once again offering additional services to celebrate the holidays. This year our Blue Christmas Service will return on Saturday (21 Dec) at 5:00pm. On Sunday (22 Dec) we will have our usual 8am service with our Christmas Pageant performed at the 9:30am service. We will offer three services on Christmas Eve. Our 5pm service will be family orientated with our youth and adult bell choirs, along with vocal choir. Our 7pm service will be a typical Rite II service with the adult bell and vocal choirs; and our 10pm service will be a typical Rite I service. On Christmas morning, we will offer a simple Eucharist beginning at 10am. There will be no Wednesday morning service on 1 Jan. However, Compline will still be shared at 8pm on New Year's Day. Please plan to join us this Christmas Eve or Day to give thanks for the love God revealed to us with the birth of Jesus. End of year giving



For those in our parish who are 70 ½ or older in 2024, did you know that you can make a qualified charitable distribution (QCD), of up to \$100,000, from your IRA directly to Church of the Holy Spirit? For those who are not yet 70 ½, once you reach this age, current tax laws mandate that you take minimum distributions from your IRA called your required minimum distribution (RMD). These distributions from your IRA are included in your taxable income.

However, the QCD reduces the amount of your IRA distribution included in taxable income and reduces your RMD. If you are using the standard deduction, using a QCD will reduce your taxable income by the amount distributed directly to the parish, thus reducing your income taxes even though you do not itemize your deductions. A win-win. (This is an extract taken from an information flier provided by our Diocesan Treasurer.)

Snow Days

With winter upon us, here is a brief reminder of how church activities are impacted by the weather. During the week (Monday – Friday), when the Bellevue Schools are closed due to hazardous road conditions the office will be closed and all scheduled parish activities (except for AA and AlAnon) are cancelled. Should the schools be closed for cold temperatures/wind chills, the office will be open during normal business hours. After hours activities may be held at the discretion of the coordinating ministry. When hazardous road conditions are present, please call the office at 402-291-7732 before venturing out to make sure someone is here.



On the weekends, every effort to hold regular services will be attempted. Should inclement weather arrive on a weekend, before making the journey to CHS, please check Facebook and/or the parish website for information about services. Fr. Tom will post any cancellations or change in service times at least 30 minutes before the originally scheduled service times.




Mobile Pantry

Vestry Meeting Minutes November 21, 2024

Vestry Members present: Fr. Tom Jones, Barb Smith, Cindy Pekarek, Judy Darrell, Kristi Smith, Lori Erickson, and Rick Horejs, Vince Cummings, Jr. Also present: Carol McLaughlin, recorder.

The meeting was called to order at 6:35 PM. Father Tom opened the meeting with prayer. He then introduced scout Taegan McCornick who presented his proposal for an Eagle Scout Project. Taegen outlined his plan to remove the large overgrown bushes along the west side of the church and replace them with new bushes that will grow to a moderate height, about 3 feet tall. There was discussion as to the type of bushes; Taegan will measure the space and get information on a few different varieties and present them for approval. For fundraising he would like to hold a pancake breakfast at the church. A car wash was also suggested to him. He plans to begin the project in early spring, and estimates that it will take around 2 weeks to complete, plus extra time to water the new bushes until they take hold. A vote was held, and it was unanimous in favor of this proposed project.

SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE: Fr. Tom advised that the information on our new rector search is now out on Facebook and is available for sharing and for potential candidates to see. Please share this to get the word out to more interested people.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Fr. Tom presented the Financials in Marcia's absence.

On the Budget vs. Actuals report, contributions are at 94% which is a little down from where we are normally, and income is at 96% overall which is not too bad. For expenditures, there wasn't anything really out of the ordinary. Interestingly, our operating income was \$17,289.74, and our operating expenses was \$17,289.55, a difference of just \$.19. Overall, we are \$6,000 in the black right now.

On the Changes in Equity report Fr. Tom noted \$2,100 expense in outreach misc. which was mostly for trunk or treat and Moving Vets Forward. Under discretionary fund, \$900 went out for t-shirts for the mission trip, and under the building fund \$330 was for new phones and \$3,358 was for the driveway lights. Also, we bought two new computers last month. We also lost \$6,800 in the endowment fund.

Balance Sheet: Net Cash Assets \$294,878. Total Available Assets \$769,473.

M011-21-01: Barb moved, and Rick seconded that we accept the reports as presented. Motion passed with unanimous approval. **M11-21-02:** Judy moved, and Lori seconded that we pay the bills. Passed with unanimous approval.

Fr. Tom went over the expenditure requests for the month, signed by Judy in the Treasurer's absence.

UPCOMING EVENTS:

Fr. Tom went over some upcoming calendar items. The Thanksgiving Eve service on November 27 will be followed by hanging of greenery in the church and the annual pie fest. The office will be closed November 28 and 29 for the Thanksgiving Holiday. The Vestry Christmas dinner is Friday, December 6. The Holiday Craft Fair and Bake Sale is December 7.

DISCUSSION ITEMS / UPDATES:

Water Damage: We received a second check from the insurance company for \$428.45 which paid for everything but our deductible.

Sanctuary Lighting: Our order was supposed to be in this month, but we have been told that the supplier was missing required paperwork. They now estimate order will be in early mid February.

Sound System/Third Microphone: What we ordered has been discontinued by the manufacturer, so we are getting new information on what is available now. We may not have in time for Christmas, depending on what we order.

Fr. Tom handed out the current Status of Pledge Drive. Our goal this year was \$211,000, and we have received pledges of \$207,000 already. He projects we will be at \$213,900. He then explained the non-pledge envelope amount of \$20,330 which was based mostly on members who usually pledge but who have not yet turned in pledges. These are included in the non-pledge figure for now. The expected budget income for next year is currently at \$241,117, but he projects we will end up at \$243,617. Subtracting expenses puts us at \$12,000 in the hole, which would actually be \$9,900 in the hole using current projections.

Fr. Tom handed out Draft #4 of the 2025 Budget. He thinks we will finish out the year pretty close to our planned income. No changes to the budgeted items in Administrative. There is one change under Building and Grounds: Utilities/Gas estimate was increased to \$6,000. The section on Rector shows an amount of \$53,050 titled Rector Variance, which represents expenses planned in support of the new Rector, which includes potential health insurance cost. The other items in red on the report are what is estimated as expense for Fr. Tom for the portion of the year that he is still here. Overall total planned expenses for 2025 comes out to \$253,522.

Fr. Tom handed out the proposed 2025 Parish Calendar and 2025 Fundraiser/Outreach schedule. Vestry members need to reach out to their ministries to verify that these dates are correct.

Kristi reported that the turnout and parish response to the presentation on Alzheimer's last Sunday was very good. Fr. Tom thanked Kristi for her work on this.

Vestry members also need to remind their ministry team leaders that Sunday December 15 is the deadline for turning in grant requests.

DECISION ITEMS:

There were no decision items this month.




